SUBJECT: **Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Covered by the NJ FamilyCare Expansion Program**

EFFECTIVE: Claims with service dates on or after January 1, 2014

PURPOSE: To notify NJ FamilyCare (NJFC) fee-for-service (FFS) providers of a State decision to expand the NJFC program to provide new opportunities for parents, single adults and childless couples to receive mental health and substance abuse services from the NJFC FFS program.

BACKGROUND: On January 1, 2014, the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services (DMAHS) expanded the NJFC program to offer healthcare, including mental health and substance abuse services, to parents, single adults and childless couples ages 19 to 64, with incomes up to 133% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). Covered groups categorized as Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC), Aged, Blind and Disabled, Long Term Care, and Juvenile Services programs are not impacted by the decision to expand NJFC. There is also no impact to benefits offered under NJFC Plans A, B, C, and D.

Prior to January 1st, the only childless adults covered by the State of New Jersey were those who qualified for the WorkFirst NJ (WFNJ)/General Assistance (GA) program. Under the NJ FamilyCare Expansion Program, DMAHS has made the decision to enroll all parents and childless adults under 133% of the federal poverty level in the new Alternative Benefit Plan (ABP) created under the new federal healthcare law.

The ABP includes all NJFC State Plan benefits including some additional mental health and substance abuse services. The ABP offers ten (10) essential health benefits including mental health and substance abuse services, non-emergency transportation, prescriptions, and a group of services for children referred to collectively as Early Prevention, Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) services. The only individuals affected by these changes are individuals in the ABP who will have the Program Status Codes of 762 and 380.

It is important to note that DMAHS is in the process of developing NJFC policies and procedures related to a Psychiatric Emergency Rehabilitative Service (PERS) based on information being received from the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS). PERS policies and procedures will be clarified in a follow-up NJFC/Medicaid Newsletter.

ACTION: Effective January 1, 2014, parents above Aid to Families with Dependent Children income requirements, single adults and childless couples became eligible to receive benefits under the ABP. The NJFC/Medicaid Newsletter Volume 23, No. 20, dated December 2013, provided a NJ FamilyCare/ABP Benefit Plan Comparison Chart that described the eligible benefits under each of the NJFC plans, as well as the ABP. Pages 6 and 7 in the Chart listed the mental health and substance use disorder services, including behavioral health treatment covered under the ABP.

- ABP claims for mental health and substance abuse services shall be paid FFS by the NJFC program, regardless of the beneficiary's enrollment in managed care.
- ABP-eligible beneficiaries receiving mental health and substance abuse services have no co-payment responsibilities related to these covered benefits.
